STRUMMING PATTERN FOR 'BILE DEM CABBAGE DOWN'



In this pattern, - represents a 'silent upstroke'. Starting slowly, make sure you leave EXACTLY the same amount of time between strokes (including the silent ones). When you can do this comfortably, begin to speed the pattern up until you get a 'galloping' rhythm.
